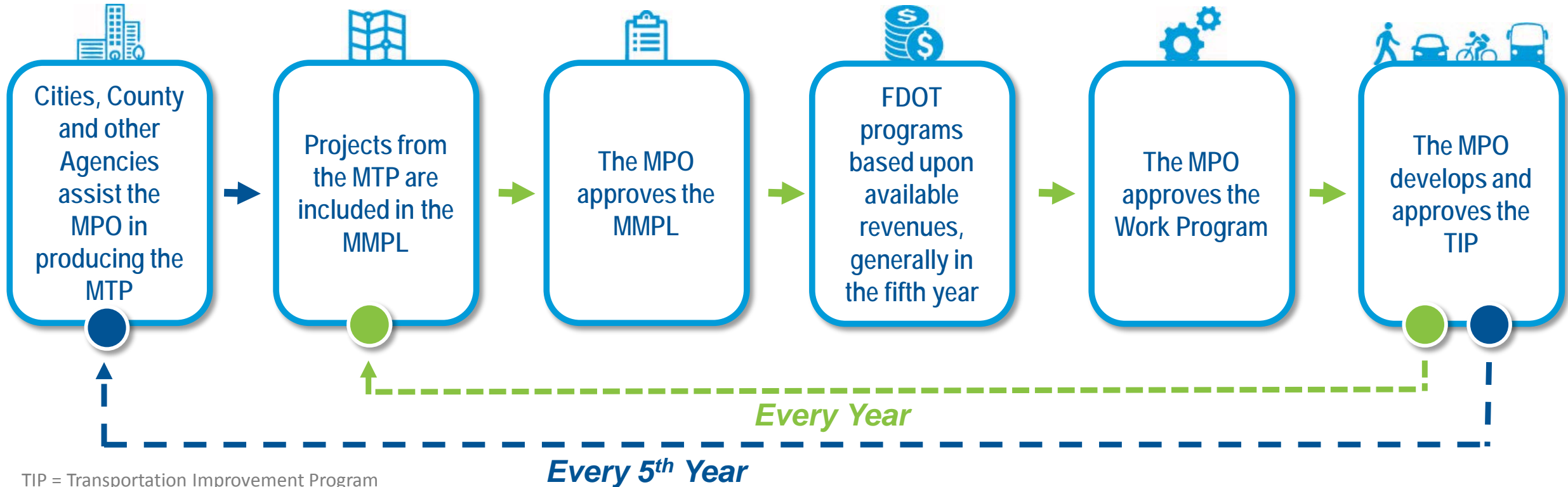

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN (MTP)* - PROCESS

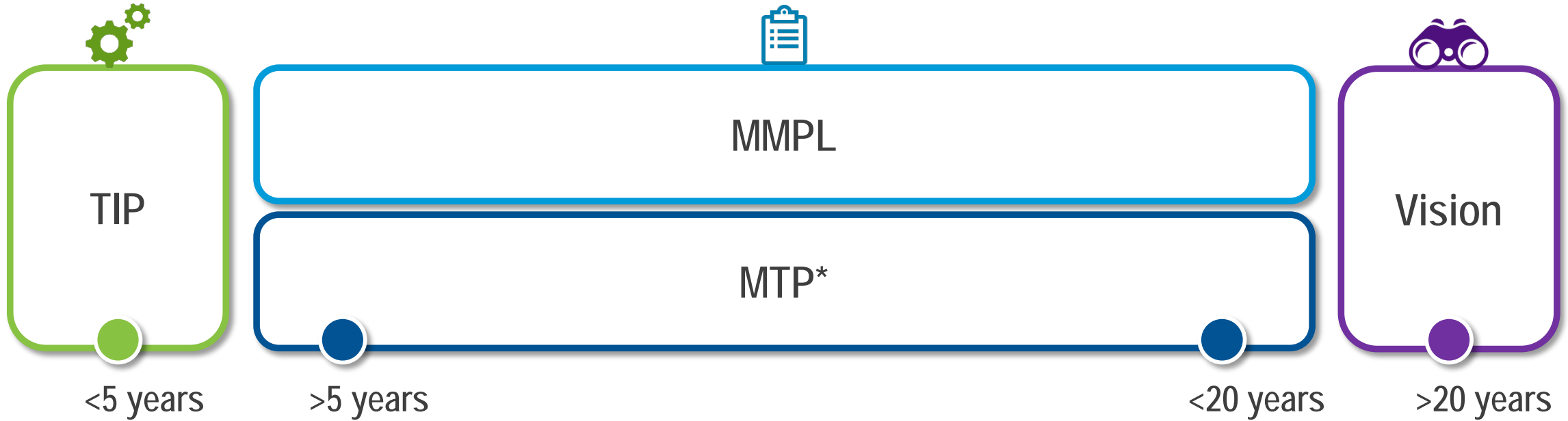


TIP = Transportation Improvement Program

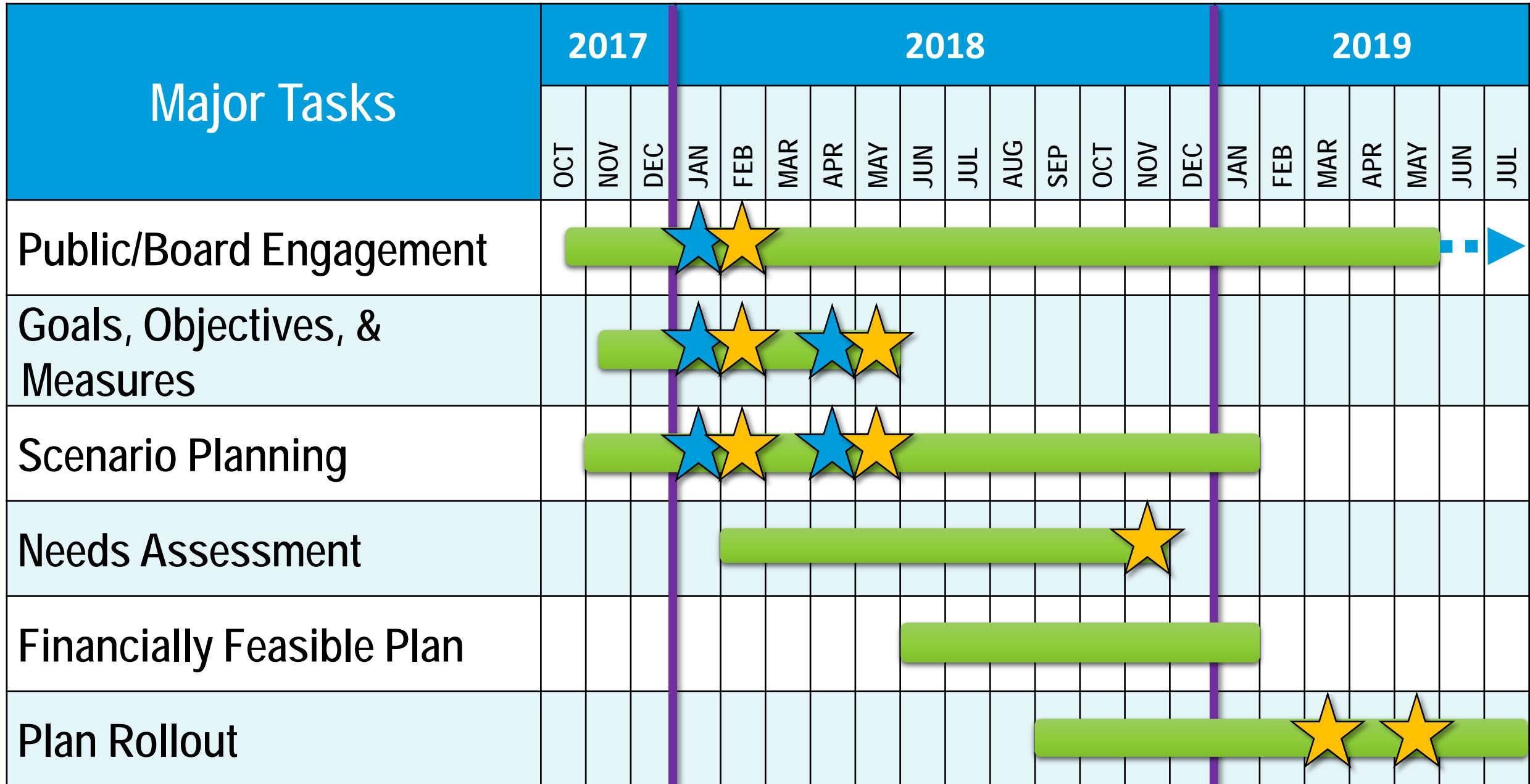

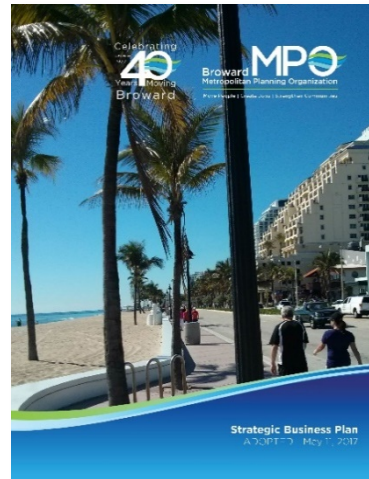
